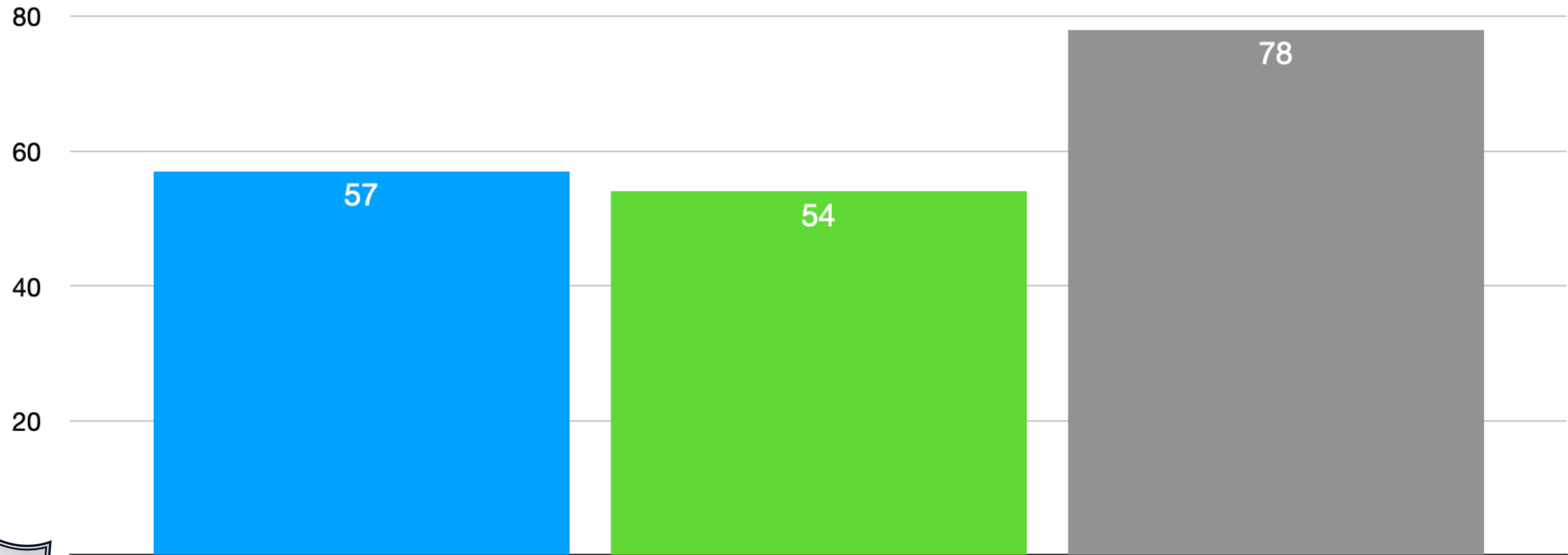

Our Spanish teacher, Mrs. Waters, shared more details on the changes in our Spanish curriculum with several parents during parent-teacher conferences.

Mrs. Brockway will meet with Mrs. Waters to document more details of the changes and share with school families.

Mrs. Waters is also consulting with other school's Spanish teachers on preparing students for the Spanish 1 Mastery Exam.

Streamline communication avenues

Is there a better way for the school to communicate with each parent? The Wildcat Weekly is designed to be a round up of information.

Mrs. Brockway will ask colleagues at other schools for details on how they communicate without overwhelming families with emails.

Time-sensitive information will be posted in the FACTS Family Portal (for example, the December lunch orders deadline is currently posted in the portal).

Add opportunities for parents to be on campus

Field trips are back in full swing this year, which is a great!

Parents are able to volunteer in music class and as helpers during morning drop off. Morning drop off is actually a pretty incredible way to meet lots of student and families.

The administration is surveying teachers for ideas on how to bring parents on campus for meaningful interactions, without risking security or causing too many distractions.

The administration has also brainstormed ideas to bring parents, such as helping in the cafeteria and designated "eat lunch with your child" days.

Mrs. Sherrill has offered to start inviting parents of first grade students to volunteer in music class, as she does for PreK-Kindergarten.

Increase understanding of Middle School culture and expectations

The Middle School faculty met with parents during the Back to School Bash to go over ground rules and frequently asked questions.

We will encourage parents with questions and concerns to contact Middle School Division Director, Mrs. Wingfield. The many different teachers in the Middle School are working to be as consistent with the rules as possible and are discussing this at each division meeting.
